At our Deacons meeting on 10th May, the Diaconate agreed to change the 2 metre rule for our church services to 1 metre ,with masks being worn as mitigation, this allows extra seating so there is no need to book in advance. Ventilation is increased so windows will remain open during the service. All our Covid-19 protocols remain in place – that means currently socialising is permissible with groups of up to 30 meeting outside and groups of six inside also allowed. 
The Persecuted Church. Continue to pray for Christians living under the constant threat of violence or injustice simply because of their faith.

This year the UK has the presidency of the G7, with the declared aim to unite leading democracies to help the world fight, and then build back better, from coronavirus and create a greener, more prosperous future. Although there are talks at different times this year, the main summit was due to run from Friday 11th to today (Sunday 13th June). Pray that agreement will be reached on a wide range of issues which affect our world, and that action will follow, to bring a better future.

Day of the African child is celebrated this week on 16th June. This is an opportunity to reflect and pray about progress towards health, equality and protection for all the continent's children. Corenavirus. Give thanks for the continuing opportunities for those who are able to do more following some relaxations in government restrictions. Pray that people will be sensible in what they do, especially with increased infection levels at present, that this will not lead to the NHS being overwhelmed with new hospital admissions, and ask that our Government will show wisdom in their decisions about whether to further ease all or some restrictions from 21st June.

In this country, while still praying for those we have long recognised as being front line workers, also pray for the workers, many of whom are on minimum wage zero hours contracts, whose work is becoming increasingly recognised as being important at this time, and who have increased workload because of Covid protocols. Pray also that **in other countries**, where people are suffering from high levels of infections and deaths, that governments and health services will work together to improve their situations.

In EBC, give thanks for being currently able to move towards reopening more activities, as well as developing new ministries. Continue to pray for the health and circumstances of so many in our church fellowship, our families and friends. Pray for those who continue to be sad, anxious or worried, and those who are wary of going out. May they have the comfort of friendship, and the deep peace of knowing they are loved"
