Welcome back to church!

We are now able to be more flexible in our services as we have come out of lockdown in England. However, the advice is for all of us to be cautious and to think of others and be mindful how close to others we are. You will see that the chairs are all out and you can sit wherever you feel comfortable. We ask that you do not attend church if you are unwell, with covid-19 symptoms or have been told to isolate by NHS test and trace. Hand sanitisers will continue to be available for your use and wearing of face coverings is also optional. Our church will also be well ventilated for your safety. Congregational singing is allowed with or without a mask, if you wear a mask we would advise that you make sure it is a good quality breathable one. If you are exempt because of lung or breathing problems please do not wear a mask.

FOR OUR PRAYER TIMES

Let's be persistent in our prayers. Pray hard and long. Pray for your brothers and sisters. Keep your eyes open. Keep each other's spirits up so that no one falls behind or drops out (Ephesians 6:18-The Message)

The Persecuted Church. Pray that, whatever their circumstances, God will give persecuted Christians the right words (Ephesians 6:19-20). Pray that persecuted Christians will understand and find peace in the sufficiency of God's grace, even in their weaknesses (2 Corinthians 12:9-10). Pray that Christians facing hardship will draw from a source of power larger than themselves (2 Corinthians1:7-9). Pray that God would be present with persecuted Christians in their hardship, protecting them according to His will (Matthew 26:39 and 42). Pray that their witness would inspire those who seek to harm them. (Luke 6:27-31; Acts 6:27-31; Acts 16:34).

Our World. Pray for our world, at this time experiencing so many problems, many of them due to the excesses and desires of greedy man. Pray about the problems of Covid 19 and other diseases in countries around the world, of climate change, famine, poverty, war, and economic imbalance between countries, and even people within countries-the gap between rich and poor. Pray that God will move, and bring hope.

Following the easing of restrictions that were announced recently, pray for wisdom from Government, other bodies, businesses and all of us, as we enter this new phase of having to live with this virus. Against the current background of increased infections, whilst being thoughtful about how this might impact others, pray that we will all learn to take responsibility for our own actions. Pray that, although technology has been a real help to us in communicating with each other during this pandemic, that deficiencies in use of the NHS app will be remedied so as to reduce the numbers of people who are having to self isolate, causing staffing problems for so many in public sector and business situations. Pray that those who are fearful may be encouraged to do a little more in safety. Let us, as church family, set a good example in all our decision making. In EBC. Continue to pray for those who are unwell, that they may rest in the care of our Lord as they receive treatment and support. For those taking a break, may they have a time of rest and relaxation, with journeying mercies and safety for those who are travelling-whether in this country or further afield. For our church and women's fellowship services as they return to a new "normal", and for other groups beginning to start again. For the plans that God has for us as a church-let's pray for clarity and a willingness to follow His leading and to give thanks for all that is currently happening."
