The theme of the service is: **"Be Encouraged"** The reading is: **Acts chapter 4 verses 32-36**


Our planned celebratory lunch will follow the service.

FOR OUR PRAYER TIMES

Let's be persistent in our prayers. Pray hard and long. Pray for your brothers and sisters. Keep your eyes open. Keep each other's spirits up so that no one falls behind or drops out (Ephesians 6:18-The Message)

Our prayers may be awkward. Our attempts may be feeble. But since the power of prayer is in the One who hears it and not in the one who says it, our prayers do make a difference (Max Lucado).

This week, as well as your normal prayers for people and situations, we ask you to concentrate your prayers on two things, persecution of our sisters and brothers in many countries, and loneliness.

The Persecuted Church. In Matthew 10:22 (NIV) it says "You will be hated by everyone because of me, but the one who stands firm to the end will be saved". India, is the second most populated country in the world, expected in that respect to overtake China in just a few years. There is an 80% Hindu majority, and a Christian minority approaching 4%. Hinduism is strongly connected to Indian identity and extreme Hindu nationalism under the ruling Bharatiya Janarta Party (BJP) is growing. Persecution and anti-Christian violence has worsened since Narendra Modi became Prime Minister in 2014. The police response to anti-Christian violence is often dismissive. During strict Covid lockdowns, in certain states where the BJP hold power, Christian families and especially pastors were refused government food aid by the distributors. Lockdown also saw a marked increase in targeted hate and violence against Christians, and some have been killed.

Since 1978, Freedom of Religion Laws have been introduced in several states. Despite their name, these are in effect anti-conversion laws banning the use of force, fraud or persuasion in conversion. Their vague terms are leading to Christians often being falsely accused of using such methods.

The Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Amendment act 2020 was passed by Parliament in September 2020. This could adversely affect religious minorities who receive funding from outside India including many Christian organisations.

Ask God to protect Indian Christians against discrimination and violence, and comfort those who have lost loved ones. Pray that rising Hindu extremism will be quelled, and that political leaders will pursue peace rather than division.

Loneliness. Many people at this time, especially with the effects of Covid on lockdown and isolation, are feeling lonely, and the length of the pandemic has worsened those feelings. But where does loneliness start? For some, certain life events may make people feel lonely, such as experiencing a bereavement or living alone after a spouse/partner has died; going through a relationship break-up; retiring and losing the social contact you had at work; changing jobs and/or feeling isolated from your co-workers; starting at university or a new school; or moving to a new area or country without family, friends or community networks (think especially about refugees). Some people may be more vulnerable to loneliness, for example, if you have no friends or family; are estranged from your family; are a single parent or care for someone else-you may find it hard to maintain a social life; belong to a minority group and live in an area without others from a similar background; are excluded from social activities due to mobility problems or a shortage of money; experience discrimination and stigma because of a disability or long-term health problem (including mental health problems), or because of your gender, race or sexual orientation; have experienced sexual or physical abuse making it harder to form close relationships with other people.

Pray for all these and other situations and, if you yourself are feeling lonely or isolated at the moment, please know that a member of the pastoral team would be pleased to speak with you and to pray for you.
